November 11, 2023

Eileen Hallman - Fresh Indigo Dye

As the proprietor of New World textiles, Eileen Hallman has been providing cotton fiber, yarn, and fabric to fiber people since 1995. In 2005, she took dye and shibori workshops with Catharine Ellis and a fresh indigo workshop with Rowland Ricketts. She has been growing and studying the properties of Japanese indigo ever since. Three years ago, she discovered through reading that there is a yellow dye in the leaf. With the primaries accounted for, the experimentation has moved on to the secondaries.

Guild Meeting/Program: The Colors of Indigo

This presentation will open our eyes to the magical properties of the Japanese indigo plant, which contains a yellow dye as well as the precursors for blue and pink. I will talk about how I got here from there, share some stories, and bring a range of colors I've obtained in the course of 17 years of research.

Mini Workshop: Ice Water Indigo - November 11, 2023

In this workshop you will learn how to harvest Japanese indigo and how to prepare the ice water bath to dye silk blue. Working primarily with silk using dried indigo leaves in a non-vat technique. Demonstrating using just leaves and water to obtain the color blue.


Extended Workshop: Primary Palette from Fresh Leaf Indigo – November 12, 13 and 14, 2023

We will work primarily with silk, using dried indigo leaves in a non-vat technique. The first morning session will use just leaves and water to obtain blue, yellow, and green. The first afternoon session will include several methods with chemical intervention to obtain pink and lavender. We will also make a lake with the spent baths. The second morning we will split the lake and dye yellow, then we will dye cotton blue. The second afternoon will be discussion and synthesis, exploring ways to combine what we know.

We will dye silk ribbon to be attached to a sample page. Each student will get 4 hankies for exploration.

Students who have grown their own indigo over the summer and dried it may bring some of it with them, a blender, and scoured silk to dye.

Fill out your name, phone number (in case the item doesn't sell and we need to contact you to return it), a brief description, and the minimum bid (starting price). You can also set a buy it now price. The auction will close for bids at 11:30. At that time the highest bidder can bring the item, sheet, and payment to the check-out. If someone chooses to buy the item at the buy it now price, they can bring the item and sheet to check-out at any time. Please make sure and bring a printed copy of the silent auction form with the item you are donating! The form is located on the website.
